I think the paper does an extremely fine job of outlining the issues and procedures involved, particularly since they are potentially unique to the legal system in the United States. My only concern is the degree to which the particulars of the OCRP program have been manualized. I was looking through the section of the paper labelled "Restoration Methods" and found no real footnotes. The reason I ask or make the comment is that if I wanted to replicate the procedure used in DC, there is no reference and only a simple set of statements to capture what the program involves. What I need from the authors is simply a statement about whether the process is more a philosophy or stance towards the issue or a set of procedures. I can infer the former due to the need to deal with medication, international, and minority status of defendants combined with cognitive and literacy issues. Otherwise, I found the paper informative and the data representation simple but persuasive.
