By reading the title of the paper by Reuzzi L et al one would expect to read about new strategies to face the problems of kidney transplantation in pediatrics. But most of the contents (pages 4-8) are about already performed regimes, and not about cutting edge or challenging the frontiers of the field. I suggest the authors to either change the title, or to start it out from pages 8 onwards, and to deepen the discussion and only to describe the performed studies. I also believe the manuscript needs major revision of the English language. I will be pleased to review the new version.
