Their argument for glomerular hematuria as a cause of renal disease outcome is an interesting one, yet not strongly supported by the paper. Regardless, the article is well-written and serves as an excellent review of glomerular hematuria. I enjoyed the geographic breakdown of hematuria-causing glomerular disease. I would recommend a couple of grammatical fixes and suggestions: 1) Page 5 "The most important renal guidelines" spelling correction – advice, not advise 2) Page 8 please clarify sentence: "Haematuria has been classically considered a marker of activity in ANCA vasculitis, although a recent report showed impact of persistent haematuria (determined by dipstick) on GFR at 1 year of follow-up Thanks
