The overall preparation of some parts of the manuscript is very non-professional, and it is obvious that the authors are not familiar with the principles of scientific writing. Although if the topic is very interesting in the urology era, I think authors may be given another chance to revise the article. Here I give some instances: 1. In the result section of the abstract, you'd see almost no data related to the results of the study. Introduction is too much long. In the methods section, in the second paragraph, "Including urethrocystoscopies..." authors talk about relevance of cystoscopy! Methods section is not where they should talk about such a thing. In the case reports, also, it is conventional to give the manufacturer of the instruments used for the operations.

## COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

While the details for the 9 cases presented give moderate details of the surgery's impact on life quality, it would be helpful to learn the Authors judgment of whether or not to classify the surgery as generally successful. As presented in Table 2, 4 of the 9 women required reoperation after mesh removal to correct the impact of erosion into the bladder of the corrective mesh. While Tables 1 and 2 are helpful, it would greatly improve comprehension of the techniques employed to have a staged diagram of the steps in placement of the corrective mesh as initially employed. Finally, do the tension-free vaginal tape procedures improve life quality sufficiently to advocate their use with greater frequency? The Authors might state their current view of whether their feeling that "urethral complications after sling procedures might be more common than described in the literature" is sufficient reason to restrict this surgery in potential candidates according to conditions that they might list. Overall, the intervention clearly has limited benefit in approximately one-half of women to whom it is applied (Table 2).
