The summary needs to be improve. It do not explain the importance of the case report, specially, that the patient was in hemodialysis. Introduction is too short. Case report lack of data about treatment; specifically, the use of renin-angiotensin-axis blockers and



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the timeline of its use with the evolution of the renal function. Was a microscopic study of renal artery sample performed? Explain the results. How do the authors explain the obstructive uropathy after surgery? Could it be a main cause of renal function? Discussion needs a thoroughful description of previous cases.

A well written case- report clearly illustrated how a revascularization improved the renal function of a patient with FMD under chronic hemodialysis. It is a very precise case to demonstrate how to manage renal failure and 2nd hypertension second to Renal



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artery stenosis. If authors can add a blood pressure trend to Figure 3 and also point out the main interventions/events (e.g. ex vivo reconstruction on April/2018, re-turn dialysis on Dec/2016) on the Serum creatinine trend figure, it will make the figure more readable. Hence, it will improve the quality of the manuscript

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
