The present paper adds insighht to the perspective of integrated processing of affective and cognitive stimuli. Authors are strongly encouraged to broaden the scope of their review in "Future directions" towards psychopathology by including 2-3 references and few sentences in that sense. My recommendation is to send the paper for careful language editing, as in some of the paragraphs English is inconsistent and confusing.

"Finally, in the current review, we only summarized the studies pertaining to the effect of emotion on working memory in healthy adults. Nevertheless, there are many studies exploring the association between emotion and working memory among individuals with psychopathology (e.g., major depression, post-traumatic stress disorder, schizophrenia) [63-65]. Future study could broaden the scope of the review towards the impact of emotion on working memory in behavioral and neuroimaging research in psychopathology."
