In the revised version of our submission we have added the following text: "A tentative explanation could be that racial/ethnic differences were implicated in this elevated rate of hypertension: blacks and hispanics have a two-fold higher rate of hypertension in pregnancy compared to whites. Nevertheless, approximately 75% of the population which was included in the study by Xaverius et al were white."

*Specific Comments to Authors: The topic is interesting. The impressive finding "pregnant women with diabetes, at least 84.5% of the subjects had hypertension" delivered by the large study, merits additional clarifications.*
