Rare site of metastatic disease from lung to the bladder. Please review and make language and grammatical changes - few examples as below squamous cell carcinoma antigen, 0.99 ng/mL - is it relevant in adenocarcinoma? In history of past illness - was found to have a pulmonary nodule due to the pain in left leg in the hospital in April 2019 - Were you planning to say - Patient with history of pulmonary nodule presented with pain in her left thigh in April 2019

Answer: For the patient, the tumor markers were detected including squamous cell carcinoma antigen because Histological transformation could occur after targeted therapy. In history of past illness, the patient went to the hospital because of the pain in the left leg, and then was found to have a pulmonary nodule.

Here are a few suggestions: The conclusion can be modified; the current conclusion is not doing justice to the rare finding report, especially in the abstract part. Submitted radiology images are of substandard quality; better images shall be added. Bladder biopsy and IHC photomicrographs shall be added
