Comments to the Author: The manuscript is lack of evidence for vasculitis
In our case, biochemistry lab data showed mild elevated CRP level, indicated possible inflammatory status. Computed tomography angiography also revealed mild mural thickening and wall enhancement which may indicate mild vasculitis. The final pathology report of the resected specimens disclosed the diagnosis with extensive necrosis of the lung, hypervascularity and reactive lymphoid hyperplasia. I've added comprehensive discussion in the revised manuscript for the evidence of vasculitis in our case.
