Title: Dellen-like Keratopathy Associated with Glaucoma Drainage Devices

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Name of Journal: World Journal of Clinical Cases

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The manuscript has been improved according to the suggestions of reviewers:

1. Format has been updated
2. Revision has been made according to the suggestions of the reviewer
 - (1) Dry eye disease was confirmed and added to the medical history. Topical treatment had already been mentioned as preservative free artificial tears.
 - (2) No eyelid pathology was present. This was added to the exam section of text
 - (3) No systemic collagen disease was present. This was added.
 - (4) The differential diagnosis was short, but was addressed. It was noted that it was related to either dellen formation, antimetabolite application, or aqueous humor fluid dynamics related to the bilateral shunts. It was also noted that it is likely bilaterally symmetric as a result of glaucoma drainage devices being present in both eyes. The pathology was immediately anterior to the devices.
 - (5) A difference between typical dellen formation and dellen-like keratopathy was listed in the text. Dellen-like keratopathy covers a much greater area than that caused by pterygia for example. No attempt was made to look at pathologic differences.
