Yet minor concerns existed and should be addressed: 1. Language is acceptable but small defects existed and can be polished and improved further. 2. A sketch roadmap of the campaign

adopted for the control of hepatitis B and C in Portugal will help the reader understand this paper better.”.

Amendment: Regarding the first point raised by the reviewer, as referred in the topic above some grammar corrections were performed. Concerning the second point, we do not have a sketch roadmap of the campaign. With this manuscript we intend to outline the efforts made over the years by all Hepatologists in order to raise awareness of the general public for liver disease. Some campaigns, like the Liver on Tour project (devoted to increase the public awareness on liver health and liver diseases), were launched throughout the country and consisted of a road show, travelling through and reaching all 18 district capitals of Portugal.
