This manuscript of case report describes the successful treatment of a patient who complained of unexplained abdominal pain by removing a fish bone migrating to pancreas. Although, such case is rare, but sometimes has been reported in the form of a case report. Nonetheless, this paper is unique in that the findings from the upper endoscopy suggested foreign body penetration. If minor revisions such as the following are performed, it will be a better case report.
