Response to comment: English language needs further polishing. For example, "case 1. And case 2 finally underwent a Laparoscopic partial cystectomy" you cannot start a sentence with "And", laparoscopic does not need a capital letter, while in other points of the manuscript you forgot it. Tables and figures should stay at the end of the manuscript (you can find guidelines for writing on WJCC website), and in the section chief complaints Case 1 and Case 2 must be separated.

Response: We have studied comments carefully and have made correction according to the Reviewer's comments. We are very sorry for our negligence that laparoscopic does not need a capital letter and we have corrected which is marked in red in the paper. "And" in the sentence "case 1. And case 2 finally underwent a Laparoscopic partial cystectomy" was deleted. We have made correction and make sure that Tables and figures stay at the end of the manuscript and in the section chief complaints Case 1 and Case 2 separated according to the guidelines for writing on WJCC website.
