Reviewer) Important study as paradoxical reactions are not very uncommonly seen during endoscopic procedures. However, being a retrospective analysis, it is very difficult to account for confounding factors and identify paradoxical reactions. In the methods section, the authors have mentioned that the paradoxical reactions were monitored by a trained nurse only.

Reply: Thank you for your important comment. We added the limitation for confounding bias (Page 12, lines 23-25). In this study, we evaluated the presence and severity of paradoxical reactions according to the physicians and the trained nurses, as described in the Discussion section (Page 10, lines 17-19). However, our description regarding this in the Methods section was unclear. Thus, we revised the manuscript (Page 7, lines 9-11)
