In daily clinical practice it is vitally important to listen to the patient, but in this type of publication this is not enough, it must be measurable and quantifiable.

We did not do the quantifiable test of quality of life before and after the intervention on the patient, but the patient was relaxed during the process. Besides, we noticed that the digital guide plate was stable and not easy to cause foreign body sensation nor fall off.
