The authors organized very well a sequence of available knowledge to document and share experiences in transitioning from traditional face-to-face programs to remote form combined with proceduralization nursing training mode in our daily work experiences during the COVID-19 pandemic, which has shown to be helpful for nurses working in the ICU. The article has potential to be useful to hospital teams. The only two fragments where I recommend revision are: 1) some minor English revision; and 2) modify the format of tables.
