Endoluminal agents: In young children and infants there are no special volume data per kilogram available. In our experience endoluminal agents will be applied in an amount which is tolerable by the infant.

Suitable ages for different techniques: The use of MR enteroklysma is possible in all age groups. But, a excellent cooperation with anaesthesia is necessary to use the nasojejunal tube for the application of the endoluminal agent. In infants and young children the use of hydro MRI (oral application of endoluminal agent) is difficult because reduced compliance. So, in these patients the dilation of the small bowel often is unsufficiently. In older children hydro MRI can be an alternative especially in children with reduced compliance for nasojejunal tube.
