Reviewer 1: (a) stated that it was unclear if this was a retrospective or prospective data, we answered the question in the first paragraph of the method section that this is a retrospective study (despite that the data were collected prospectively since 2001 as part of our transplant registry). (b) Abbreviations was frequently used in the manuscript but no expansion of abbreviations. For example What is the OLT, HCC, HBV?? There are even abbreviations in the title. All abbreviations in the manuscript were expanded and defined when they appeared for the first time in the manuscript we also removed the abbreviation in the title as suggested by the reviewer.

Reviewer 2: (a) stated the authors aim to analyze the tendency in liver transplant from

HBV-related hepatic decompensation to HCC, not a indication of LT, so the title is very

necessary to be revised. We discussed in the results the decreasing indication of HBV

related transplantation in our program throughout the last ten years we also compared that with other international data, so in addition to describing the changing trend from decompensation to HCC we elaborated on the decreasing indication, therefore we

maintained the title as it is (see highlighted part). (b) In the matter of statistical analysis, t

value or χ^2 value are need to enhance your article authority. Statistical analysis was reviewed by our senior statistician and t test was used we also expanded on the analysis

in the abstract. (c) Several words should be corrected in the revision. We revised the

manuscript and improved the language and wordings were changed in multiple segments.
