 2. More content should be added. What are the current research progress and hotspots in Esophagogastric junction outflow obstruction (EGJOO)?

Response: thank you for your comments and suggestions. We have added a section discussing the LES directed treatment modalities (botulinum injection, pneumatic dilation, and POEM) and addressing their advantages and disadvantages. Most of the studies that are cited in the manuscript are recent and published within the last 2-3 years. The EGJOO is an evolving entity and more research is required to further elucidate this interesting diagnosis.
