1. Abstract. Short conclusion should be added.

**Response:** We have added a short conclusion at the end of the abstract---“As a whole, hepatic artery variant may not worsen surgical and oncological outcomes as long as it is accurately identified preoperatively and appropriately managed intraoperatively.”

2. Background. THERE IS NO INTRODUCTION OR BACKGROUND.

3. Methods. THERE IS NO DESCRIPTION FOR MATERIALS AND METHODS. SHOULD BE.

**Response:** We have added the Methods Section in the revised manuscript as follows:

**Methods**

A thorough search was performed in the PubMed database for relevant studies on variant hepatic artery and pancreatic resection. The search terms used “aberrant” or “variant” or “anomaly” AND “hepatic artery” AND “pancreaticoduodenectomy” or “pancreatectomy”. All available studies published in the English or Chinese language between January 2000 and November 2021 (a total of 131 articles) were potentially included.
