We have made several modifications to this manuscript, which are summarized in a point-to-point manner as follows:

The comments from the reviewers:

Reviewer #1: This is a concise letter to the editor, and it is important to know the reply of the authors of the original paper (Ma et al)

We thank a lot for the encouragement from this reviewer.

Reviewer #2: Authors of the letter made a critique about the nomogram constructed by Ma et al. (WJG 27(38): 6465-6475). The contested parts of the article are legitimate, the original nomogram should have considered side, mutation-, MSI/MMR- and resectability status of the tumor. A minor suggestion is that instead of “issue” authors should use “limitation”, in my opinion.

The word “issue” had been replaced by the word “limitation” in this letter, as the reviewer advised.

The comments from the editorial service:

(1) Science editor:

This is a letter that critiques the nomogram constructed by Ma et al. (WJG 27(38): 6465-6475). The limitations raised are valid, and raises awareness to readers.

Language Quality: Grade B (Minor language polishing)
