Reviewer #1:

Specific Comments to Authors: This study reviewed the epidemiology, the pathophysiology, the histopathological aspects, the current recommendations and novel perspectives in surveillance of non-cirrhotic NAFLD-related HCC. This article is comprehensive and well-written. However, it would be better if the author briefly described the NAFLD in the INTRODUCTION part.

Answer: a new description of NAFLD and MAFLD was added in the introduction (lines 68-85)

Reviewer #3:

1. On page 6, in the last sentence, please define 'OR' and 'CI'. Some other abbreviations should be defined at the first time of use.

Answer: The suggestion was accepted and corrected in the text (lines 174-175)

2. On page 7, in the first sentence of the first paragraph, is MBOAT or MBOAT7?

Answer: The suggestion was accepted and corrected in the text (line 177)

3. On page 7, in the first sentence of the second paragraph, please remove 'TM6SF2 transmembrane 6 superfamily member 2 (TM6SF2)'.

Answer: The suggestion was accepted and corrected in the text (line 182)

4. On page 7, in the second paragraph, what do you mean '167K' allele? Please define it.

Answer: This was corrected in the text (line 185)

5. On page 7, in the fourth paragraph, 'hTERT' stands for human Telomerase reverse transcriptase, so you may add human before Telomerase reverse transcriptase or remove 'h' from hTERT.

Answer: The suggestion was accepted and corrected in the text (line 195)

6. On page 8, in the first line, remove a space before Hyperinsulinemia.

Answer: The suggestion was accepted and corrected in the text (line 207)

7. In 'Mallory denk bodies' should be 'Mallory Denk bodies'.

Answer: The suggestion was accepted and corrected in the text (line 384)

8. In 'NOVEL PERSPECTIVES IN SURVEILLANCE FORM HCC IN NAFLD', is 'FORM' or 'FOR'?

Answer: This was corrected in the text (line 456)

9. In conclusion, remove '(sugestão)'.

Answer: This was corrected in the text (lines 553-555)
