Starting with the abstract HHT is characterized by the presence of multiple arteriovenous malformations (AVMs) Therefore vasodilatation is not suitable. The mutation analysis results make the case in this patient even more interesting, so it would be more appropriate to evaluate these results as a peer review by a geneticist. The University of Utah has a large mutation database regarding HHT, if possible, it would be appropriate to contact and screen it.

Reply: Regarding the suggestions made by Reviewer 2, we wholeheartedly acknowledge their significance. However, despite our best efforts, we discovered that the HHT database at the University of Utah is currently not accessible to the public. We also sought assistance from several genetic testing companies, but unfortunately, all attempts to establish a comparison with our database were unsuccessful. Nevertheless, we sincerely thank the reviewer for their invaluable input, and we will continue to closely monitor this database, hoping for an opportunity to conduct data comparison in the future.

In addition, we have adhered to the editorial requirements and conducted a thorough search in the RCA database, supplementing our work with the latest

developments related to HHT.
