**Comments:** "Pls add close follow up in patients whose initial imaging like CT scan is normal on the flow chart. There are cases where mild collection is overlooked by radiologist reported as normal and patient then visits another hospital since primary surgeon has said " All is well ".

"Pls add specific treatment algorithm for Strasberg Gade C, D, E like it's mentioned for Aand B Also concise the text avoid repetitions"

This aspect of close follow-up has now been added to the flowchart (Figure 2)

Figure 3 has been revised entirely and now includes schematic treatment algorithms for Strasberg A-E lesions.

In addition, the English language of the revised manuscript has again been polished by a native English certified translator. The manuscript text is completely revised and repetitions have been removed. A new language certificate is included in the submission. Abbreviations and other technical issues pointed out by the editor have been corrected.
