1. The authors report a case of a bleeding giant gastric ulcer complicated by subsequent gastric wall necrosis. Injection of sclerosants and tissue glue may lead to gastric wall necrosis, which is a serious complication. Therefore, before administering this treatment to patients, we should consider other more effective methods of hemostasis to avoid gastric wall necrosis. It would be interesting to include a short review of the literature on this problem.
