This review proposes the use of specific assessment tools such as the Clinical Frailty Scale and Charlson Comorbidity Index for determining whether to recommend CRC screening to an older patient, and organizes them in a framework that is helpful when addressing this issue in the clinical setting. Endoscopic technique and management of anticoagulation are also addressed in order to minimize complications when proceeding with screening colonoscopy. The combination of the gastroenterologist perspective with that of the geriatrician makes this paper innovative in its review of the literature and approach to screening decisions for older adults.
