The article was class B for language quality; We thank Nicolas Goossens Native English speaker for the thorough edition of this manuscript.

Major comments: Currently, thanks to the advancements in CT technology, most of the hepatic artery-related complications are accurately diagnosed by multidetector row CT without the need of invasive angiography. Therefore, the description, “If hepatic artery stenosis or occlusion is suspected by Doppler US, hepatic angiography is usually indicated before continuing with other tests,” in the paragraph titled “Diagnostic approach” should be changed.

The paragraph has been changed, highlighted in the edited manuscript (page 7 lines 11 to 15) and two new references about the topic have been inserted.

For some refractory anastomotic stricture, rendezvous technique (PTC + ERCP) is effective to proceed stents beyond the anastomotic stricture. A summarized paragraph regarding this topic is informative to readers.

A short paragraph has been added, highlighted in the edited manuscript (page 13 line 9 to 14), and a new reference about the topic has been inserted.

Minor comments: In Page 4, number the paragraphs correctly. In Page 5, Line 27, “isquemic” should be “ischemic.” In Page 9, Line 16, “leaded” should be “led.”

The corrections have been done.

*The paragraph numbers were corrected (page 6).
The misspelled words were corrected (“isquemic” by “ischemic” page 7, line 29). (“leaded” by “led” page 11, line 25).*


