Minor Comments: "Author contributions: All authors equally contributed to this paper with conception and design of the study, literature review and analysis, drafting and critical revision and editing, and final approval of the final version." – As there is only one author, this statement should be adapted accordingly. For those not so familiar with this specific topic, a "List of Abbreviations" at the beginning of the article would be helpful. Page 29, section "SWIMRT", first sentence: "...a prostate patient with [...] prostate cancer..." -> "...a patient with [...] prostate cancer...". The reference list does not contain PMIDs/DOIs.
