Although there are few reports on the data of IBD specific immunosuppression and steroid regimen and the period after renal transplantation, the authors propose that the low overall survival rate of IBD patients receiving renal transplantation may be due to the effect of IBD and immunosuppression on renal transplantation, and suggest further research. Title Please do not abbreviate IBD in the title. Consider using the terms "Immunosuppressive" and "regimes" in the title. The title is unclear; please consider using a more informative and clearer one. Letter The aim of the present study (letter) is unclear and should be more clearly explained at the begging of the article. The authors state that "IBD is a chronic systemic autoimmune disease". It would be more appropriate to state that IBD is an "immunomediated" disease. The authors conclude that patients with IBD that undergo kidney transplantation have shorter overall survival rates compared to their controls. And then conclude that "This could be because of the effects of IBD and immunosuppression on the transplanted kidney". However, this conclusion does not seem to be based on the results/reports previously mentioned by the authors in the text. REFERENCES OK. | Thankyou for your helpful comments.
