I have several comments regarding this paper: In my opinion the paper is acceptable, but the World Journal of Gastrointestinal Surgery or the World Journal of Gastrointestinal Oncology are better fit. 1) A retrospective study requires Institutional Research Committee approval at least in USA and Europe 2) An endoscopic ultrasonography (EUS) with FNA is often more precise than CT scan
