Interesting case report of an important finding. They have addressed the reviewers points. One minor point: In "Comments" section, "Experiences and lessons" the language is poort and I suggest it is changed to: "A case of implantation of esophageal cancer to gastric ulcer after ESD is extremely rare. However this possibility should be kept in mind and strategies to manage patients with double cancers should be developed carefully."
