In Abstract: “No statistical difference was found for DASH and Mayo outcome scores between the two groups ($P < 0.001$).” Clearly, the “ $p < 0.001$ ” here is incorrect. According to the authors: for DASH score: $p = 0.679$; and for Mayo score: $p = 0.859$. Please make corrections. Page 9, First paragraph in RESULTS section, last sentence: “This patient was well as one other had a popeye deformity of the biceps (20%).” This is very confusing. Please rewrite and make it clear to readers. Page 11 last sentence: “More patients with chronic rupture were treated than is normal as patients were referred to the senior author when it became known in his community that he was willing to operate on them.” Rewrite and correct grammar errors. Please revise the manuscript carefully to correct any grammar errors and typos.
