As authors have stated, this is a preliminary study approaching clinical trials in the field of radiology. Despite their efforts to address the issues raised by the two reviewers, there are still rooms for the authors to further improve the paper quality by responding to the following aspects. 1. Page numbers are missing, which troubled reading and reviewing. 2. To more precisely reflect the contents of this investigational work, consider modifying its title into “Radiological clinical trials: propose a problem-finding questionnaire to improve study success” . 3. There still exist numerous typographic, grammatical, punctuational and wording errors, which have to be carefully fixed. A few examples are: “Nity-four percent”, “showed interested in conducting clinical trials”, “by Radiologists”, “As indicate by”, “could separated from”, “don’t support” and etc. Therefore, a professional standard written English service would be recommended.
